Course description:

This presentation will discuss the standards for best supervisory practices for students, clinical fellows, and mentees. Therapists will gain resources to identify and design a structured supervisory program to develop students, clinical fellows, and new practitioners in the fundamentals of practice, prevention, evaluation, and intervention skills while learning to manage services. The development of communication skills and professional behaviors will be reviewed. Tools to support the development of independence, self-reflection, and critical reasoning will be provided utilizing research principals and evidence-based practices.
